How to Read this Chart

Column A: This column refers to the total capacity of JK/K classrooms at each school.

Column B: These are the current Junior Kindergartners plus the 3-year average of students who may repeat their kindergarten year and who would take seats next year as second-year Kindergartners.

Column C: This column refers to the estimated seats available after rising Junior Kindergartners are accounted for.

Column D: These are the number of siblings who applied for seats in last year's lottery, both JK and K.

Column E: These are the number of applicants who received Proximity points in their first choices in the previous year's lottery.

Column F: These are the estimated net number of seats available for this year's Kindergarten Lottery when Columns B, D, E, are subtracted from Column A.

Please note: Column D represents numbers from the previous year's lottery and are presented here for informational purposes and could vary in this year's lottery. The Tobin Montessori was part of the 3 Year-Old Lottery in the fall and there may be as few as zero seats available for students ages 4-5 at Tobin Montessori.

Although there are a few schools in Table #1 with zero available seats estimated at the time of the JK/K Lottery for students without bonus points, a small number of seats do open up for students on those waitlists.

Please remember: All seats are subject to SES controls (Free/Reduced Lunch and Paid Lunch).

How to Read this Chart

Column A: This column refers to the total capacity of JK/K classrooms at each school.

Column B: These are the current Junior Kindergartners plus the 3-year average of students who may repeat their kindergarten year and who would take seats next year as second-year Kindergartners.

Column C: This column refers to the estimated seats available after rising Junior Kindergartners are accounted for.

Column D: These are the number of siblings who applied for seats in last year's lottery, both JK and K.

Column E: These are the previous year's applicants who received the language bonus points.

Column F: These are the net number of seats available when Columns B, D, E, are subtracted from Column A.

Please note: Column E represents numbers from the previous year's lottery and are presented here for informational purposes and could vary in this year's lottery. Language schools offer bonus points for students who speak the program language and for siblings of current students. Dual Immersion Programs do not offer proximity points.

Although it is estimated that Amigos and MLK's Chinese Immersion Program will have zero available seats at the time of the JK/K Lottery for students without bonus points, a small number of seats do open up for students on those waitlists.

Please remember: All seats are subject to SES controls (Free/Reduced Lunch and Paid Lunch).

*** It is important to remember that these charts represent estimates based on a mix of current and last year's data. The available number of seats in the Immersion Programs has varied over the past five years.**

How to Read this Chart

F/R = Refers to the number of students who participated in the Lottery that qualified for Free and Reduced priced meals.

Paid = Refers to the number of students who participated in the Lottery that did not qualify for Free and Reduced priced meals.

App = Refers to the number of students who "Applied" to the school.

Assign = Refers to the number of students who were "Assigned" to the school through the lottery.

AB, OB, CB = Refers to the bilingual category in our Immersion programs, this designation is used to categorize students who speak the program language (Spanish, Portuguese or Chinese) **AN, ON, CN** = Refers to the non-bilingual category in our immersion programs, this designation is used to categorize students who do not speak the program language.

None= Refers to the number of students who did not make any choices in their 2nd or 3rd choice schools.

MJK4 = Refers to the Tobin Montessori - 4 year old level

MK5 = Refers to the Tobin Montessori - 5 year old level

HOW TO READ THIS CHART:

This table shows six years of data for the results of each Lottery.

Row 1 - Lottery Years mean the year the January JK/K Lottery took place.

Row 2 - This shows the total number of JK/K applicants per each Lottery.

Row 3 - This represents the number and percentage of applicants who received their **first choice** as a result of the Lottery in March. *

Row 4 - This represents the number and percentage of applicants who received their **second choice** as a result of the Lottery in March.

Row 5 - This represents the number and percentage of applicants who received their **third choice** as a result of the Lottery in March.

Row 6 - This represents the total number and percentage of applicants who received **one of their three original choices** as a result of the Lottery in March.

Row 7 - This represents the total unassigned students from each Lottery who did not receive any of their choices as a result of the Lottery in March.

Row 8 - This shows the total number and percentage of unassigned students who had been offered a seat at one of their three choices between March, after the Lottery results are know, and October 1 of the school year following the Lottery.

Row 9 - This shows the grand total number and percentage of all Lottery applicants who had been assigned by the Lottery results in March or through the waitlist process to one of their three choices by October 1. **

* In March, the Lottery results are known and assignment letters are mailed.

** While these numbers and percentages indicate the students who were either assigned or transferred to one of their three school choices, not all students chose to attend CPS.
